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Things That Grow / Helping Hands

EYFS 1 - Literacy

Letter sounds and continuation of blending - encouragement of triangulation grip for pencils.

Exaggerate sound of initial sound of pupils' names and animal words. (Listening and recognition)

Read a range of stories pointing out details of number, colour, size or shapes. Develop favourites. Learn to recognise their name on a name card.

EYFS 2 - Literacy

Formal RWI teaching in small groups. RWI – embedded and taught at a rapid pace.

Taught Technology

Start to identify initial letters of own name on the keyboard and watch the letter appear on the screen or IWB.

To use, operate and complete simple program through the use of Mini Mash on the iPad.

<u> UW – Understanding the World</u>

Continue to look after the school pets. Grow flowers and vegetables in pots and in planters outside of nursery entrance door. (Sweet peas, potatoes etc.)
