Geography: Village Settlers
Locate where Romans came from on a world map and revise the concept of Europe. Why are they called Romans?
Use internet and digi-maps to plan journey to Segedunum. Sketch 'birds - eye view' of Segedunum site from tower.

Role play - how Celts felt after invasion and during.

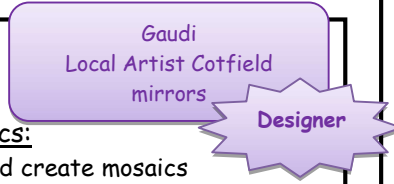
Outdoor Learning:
