Geography:

Mapping skills relating to the magical world of Harry Potter, Hogwarts and Diagon Alley. Six figure grid references, locating specific places around Hogwarts e.g. Quiddich pitch, Hagrid's hut. Investigating land elevation in and around Hogwarts' grounds. Cross section of land.

PSHE / SMSC:

Families come in various forms. What is yours like? How family members show respect and tolerance - what is acceptable & what is not. Society has rules for its citizens. Discuss the rules in the muggle world and the wizarding world. How should Harry treat the Dursley family? How would you want to treat them & what does society allow you to do? Could witches & wizards exist in our real world? Compare the Ministry of Magic with Democracy today.
